As per Whatcom County Code 24.11, in order to use a permit-exempt well for a project permit, the applicant must provide documentation of legal water availability or evidence that the project will not impair any senior water rights, including instream flows per WAC 173-501. Provide one or more of the following:

- a. A study by a WA State licensed hydrogeologist demonstrating that the proposed well would not impair any senior water right, including instream flows.*
- b. A mitigation plan prepared by a WA State licensed hydrogeologist demonstrating that the proposed well, with mitigation, would not impair any senior water right, including instream flows.*

Review of legal water availability documentation may require a third party review. The cost of the third party review will be at the expense of the applicant.
