APL2009-0009 A SEPA Appeal filed by the City of Bellingham, appealing a Revised Mitigated Determination of Non-significance made by the Whatcom County SEPA Official on March 6, 2009, regarding the application of CLN, L.L.C., Christopher and Nancy Secrist, and Gordon and Carol Iverson, for an Administrative Permit Approval allowing the construction of the proposed Squalicum Ridge Road to serve future residential home construction on up to 28 existing 20-acre residential properties currently located in the Rural Forestry zone. The issues raised in the appeal include, but are not limited to, the adequacy of the conditions in the MDNS to mitigate for the project's cumulative impacts, stormwater, tree clearing, impacts on wildlife habitat, and groundwater withdrawals. The project site is located northerly and approximately two miles east of the intersection of Academy Road and North Shore Drive on Squalicum Mountain, Bellingham, Washington.
