Rural Element Update: VISION WORKSHOPS

Whatcom County is updating its Comprehensive Plan in a project called Whatcom 2031. As a part of this update, the County is working to update its policies and regulations for managing growth and development in rural areas. The purpose of this update is to ensure that the Rural Element section of the Whatcom County Comprehensive Plan accurately reflects the values and expectations of county residents and complies with Washington's Growth Management Act.

Whatcom County needs your help! Before considering changes to its Comprehensive Plan, Whatcom County needs feedback from the community to make sure the county's actions are consistent with the community's vision of rural character. Please join the County for a series of workshops on November 12th and 13th. The following is a schedule of these workshops:

Participants at these visioning workshops will work to define the vision for the rural area of the County, answering questions like:

- What should the rural areas of Whatcom County look like?
- What lot sizes are appropriate for the rural area?
- What types of land uses are appropriate for the rural areas?
- How should we preserve agricultural land in the rural area?

Participants will work together to answer these and many other questions at the visioning workshops, the first of a series of public involvement activities for the "Rural Element Update."
