

## New to the County? Crash Course in Local Residential Recycling

Whatcom County grew by 1.1% last year. That's approximately 2700 new people who may not be wholly familiar with Whatcom County's recycling systems. Following is a quick review of recycling requirements by each of the four haulers servicing our county.

<b>Nooksack Valley Disposal *</b> 360-354-3400	<b>Newspaper with inserts and ads:</b> Place flat in bottom of bin. <b>Scrap paper:</b> Junk mail, magazines, catalogs; keep separate from newspaper inside of <u>paper</u> grocery sack (no plastic bags) and place on top of newspaper.	<b>Aluminum and Tin cans:</b> Rinse and remove labels. No aerosol cans.	<b>Glass bottles and jars:</b> All colors. Remove lids, rinse. Do not break glass.
<b>Point Recycling &amp; Refuse</b> 360-945-1516	Point Recycling and Refuse is currently going through a transitional period and isn't offering curbside recycling at the moment. <b>Sanitary Service Company (SSC)</b> 360-734-3490  <b>Blaine Bay Refuse</b> 360-332-5443 <b>(Now owned by SSC)</b>	<b>Newspaper:</b> Clean newsprint, inserts, ads. (No plastic delivery bags or rubber bands).	<b>Mixed Paper:</b> Old mail, magazines, catalogs, envelopes, stationery, labels, cartons, paper bags; computer, fax, copy & note paper; shoe & cereal boxes (discard liners and flatten).	<b>Cans, Glass &amp; Plastic Containers:</b> <u>Glass Bottles and Jars:</u> All colors. Labels & caps OK. Remove caps. Place loose in bin or Toter™. Avoid breaking glass. Bottles must be removed from 6-pak and 1/2 case boxes, etc. and placed loose in bin. <u>Aluminum Cans, Tin Cans and Foil:</u> Remove tin can labels and recycle them with scrap paper. <u>Plastic Containers:</u> Bottles, Jugs, Caps & Rings, Cups, Jars, Tubs, Pails, Buckets & Lids (max. bucket size - 1 gal. with metal handles removed). All colors & numbers. Labels OK. Remove lids & caps. Recycle loose or nested together.  <b>Please rinse all containers clean and flatten plastic, aluminum and tin containers!</b>
<b>Not Recyclable at Curbside</b> No tissue paper, paper towels, napkins, carbon paper. No wax, plastic, or foil coated containers. No styrofoam. No hazardous waste containers, or auto fluid containers. No Pyrex, mirrors, window glass, glassware, light bulbs, plate glass.	<b>Other Recyclables at Curbside</b> <b>Car Batteries</b> , if not leaking. Set alongside recycling bins. <b>Motor oil</b> must be sealed in 1 gallon screw top container. No anti-freeze. <b>Cardboard</b> should be flattened and placed next to bins or under bins. Bundle w/tape or string for Nooksack. <b>Scrap metal</b> , stripped of plastic or rubber parts. Must be less than 23" x 24" and less than 36 lbs. <u>*Plastic Bottles – Nooksack Valley:</u> Any color, with necks only. Rinse, flatten, and place in your own reusable container (not to exceed 32-gallons).
