

Dear Disposal of Toxics Customer:

Thank you for contacting the Disposal of Toxics program to inquire about waste management options for your firm's chemical waste(s). The State's Dangerous Waste Regulations (WAC 173-303) apply in this matter, and as the generator of the waste(s) you are responsible for determining your generator status through a process called designation. The Disposal of Toxics program will determine your generator status as a public service using the information you provide on the enclosed Small Quantity Generator form. The completion of this form is required to dispose of waste at the Disposal of Toxics facility.

Section 1 of the form requires your company information. Please identify a contact person who is familiar with the types and quantities of waste generated by your business.

Section 2 asks you to list all of the hazardous waste streams generated at your business site, the quantity generated per month or batch, and the process or uses by which they were generated. Please list all of your hazardous waste streams even if you do not intend to dispose of them at the Disposal of Toxics facility. This information is necessary to determine your generator status.

Section 3 asks that you list the type and actual quantity of waste you want to dispose of at the facility. An analytical laboratory must test unknown wastes, to determine constituents and concentration, prior to acceptance for disposal.

We will be better able to advise you once we have received the requested information by return mail or fax.
