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Whatcom County Health Department Awarded National Accreditation: Department Stands Out Amongst Best in the Nation

Bellingham, WA—Whatcom County Health Department (WCHD) announced today that it has achieved national accreditation through the Public Health Accreditation Board (PHAB). Fewer than 200 health jurisdictions nation-wide have achieved this status and WCHD is one of only three counties in Washington State that have achieved accreditation thus far. The national accreditation program works to improve and protect the health of the public by advancing and ultimately transforming the quality and performance of the nation's state, local, Tribal, and territorial public health departments.

"Whenever you see our seal of accreditation, you will know that WCHD has been rigorously examined and meets or exceeds national standards that promote continuous quality improvement for public health," said Regina Delahunt, Director of WCHD. "The work accomplished during the accreditation process has resulted in increased efficiencies in departmental operations and significant improvements to the many services and programs delivered by our Health Department."

The national accreditation program, jointly supported by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation, sets standards against which the nation's nearly 3,000 governmental public health departments can continuously improve the quality of their services and performance. To receive accreditation, a health department must undergo a rigorous, multi-faceted, peer-reviewed assessment process to ensure it meets or exceeds a set of quality standards and measures.

"I've been impressed with the Health Department's depth and breadth of programing, due in large part to the quality staff members who make it their mission to serve the public professionally everyday with compassion and a commitment to excellence," said Whatcom County Executive Jack Louws. "This recognition by the PHAB acknowledges the dedication and commitment by the Health Department leadership and staff to continuously strive for quality improvement that meets our community's needs. This hard earned and well deserved achievement by the Whatcom County Health Department exemplifies hard work and dedication and I am extremely proud of their many accomplishments."
