RATIO OF MISDEMEANORS TO FELONIES

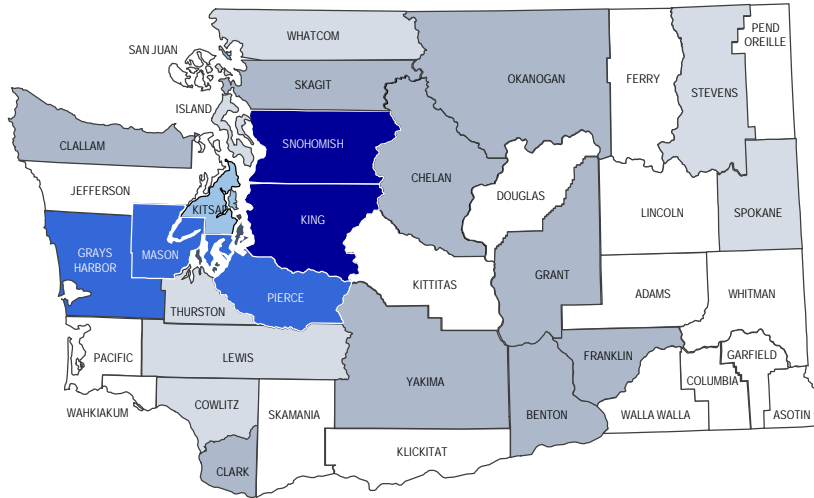
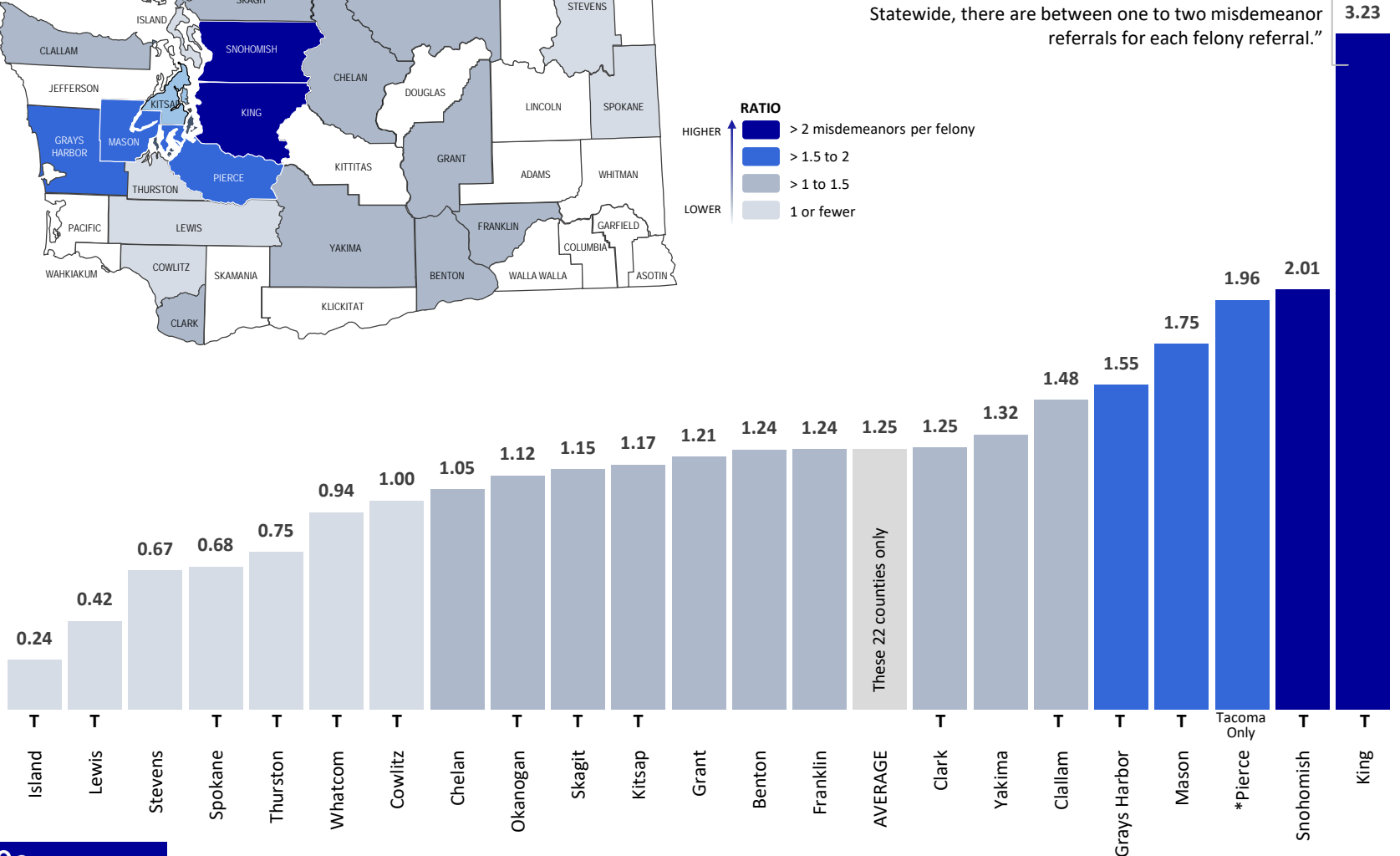
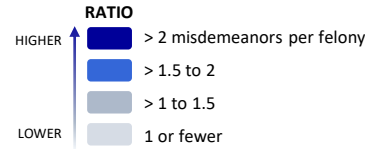

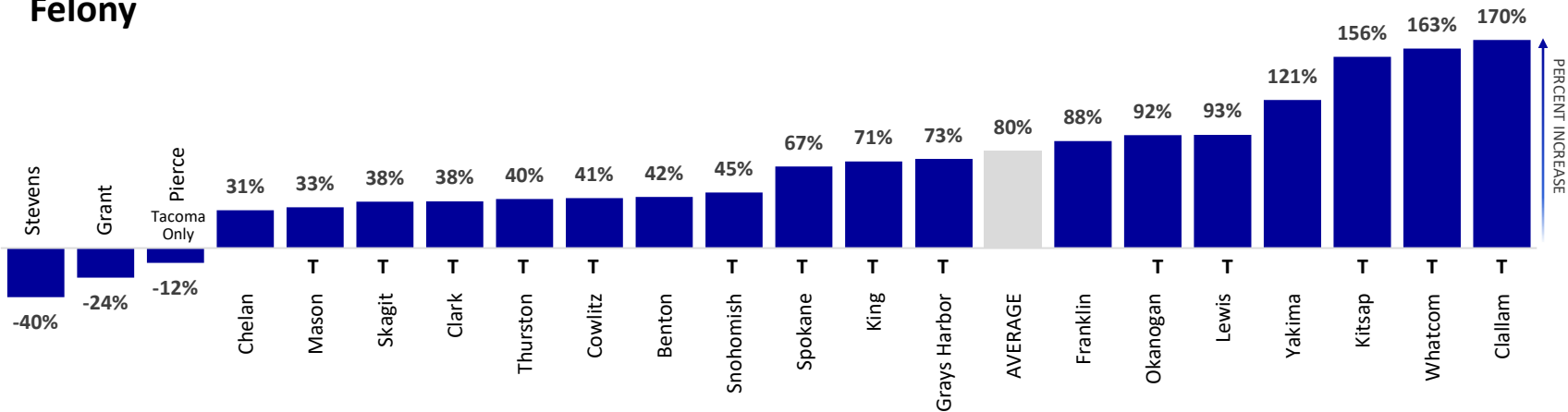

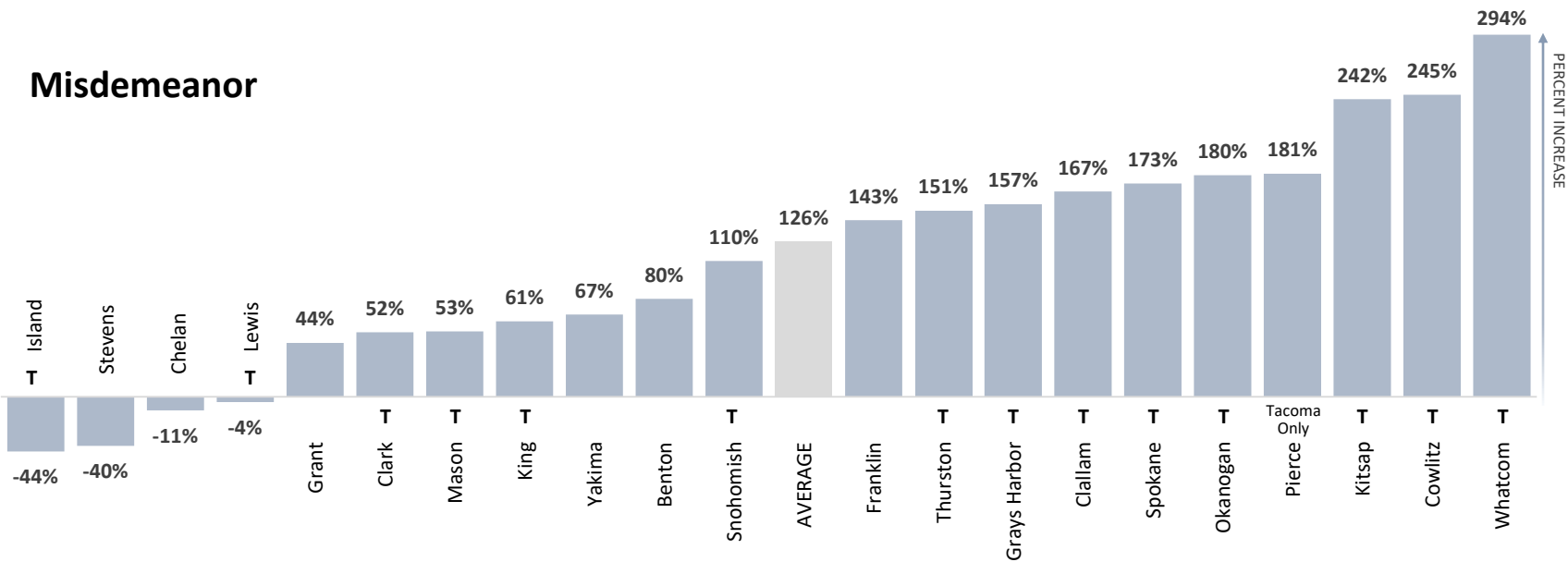
Percent Change in Competency Evaluation Referrals

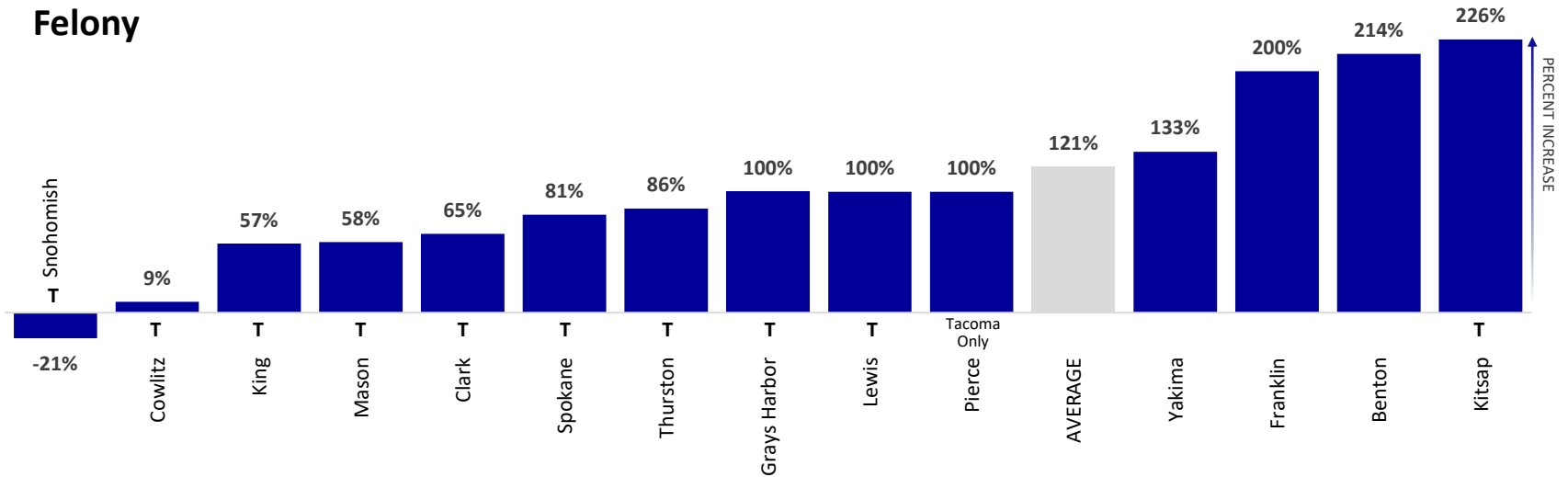

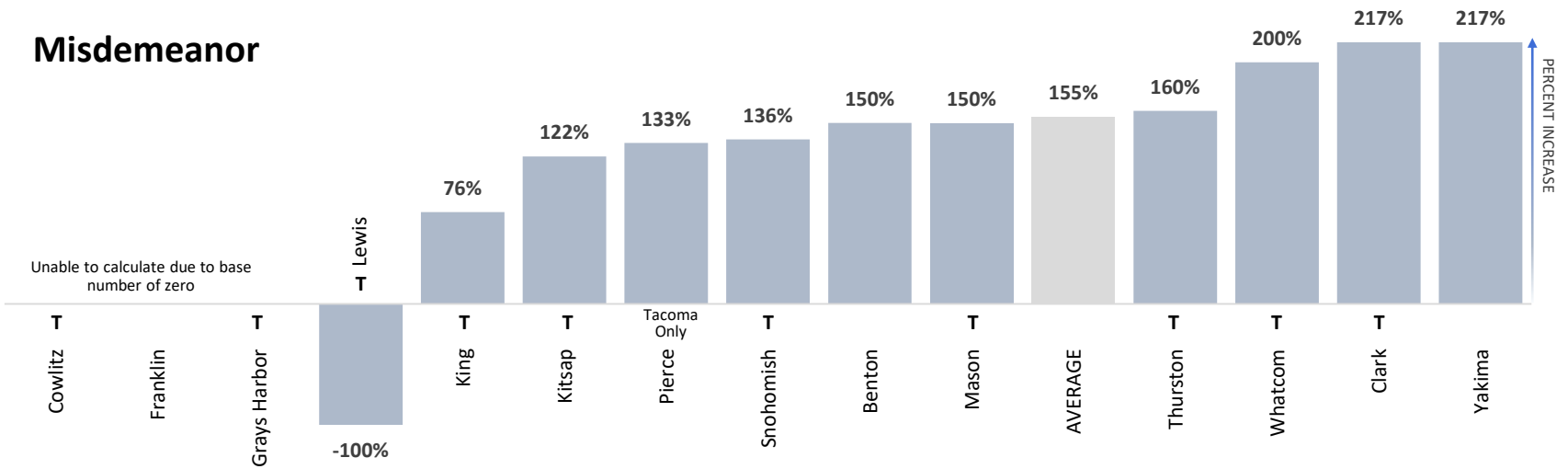
Percentage Change in Competency Restoration Referrals
