## Proposition 2020-12 Restoring Regular Property Tax Levy

The Board of Fire Commissioners of Fire Protection District 18, Whatcom County, Washington, adopted Resolution No. 2020-01 authorizing a regular property tax levy of \$1.00 per \$1,000. This proposition would authorize the District to restore and maintain its regular property tax levy to \$1.00 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation for 2020 and thereafter subject to any otherwise applicable statutory dollar rate limitations.
